

Community foundations enable people to give back to their own community and support local projects.

Donations and gifts in wills are held in trust, grown into long-term, reliable financial support for local causes.

Te Awa Community Foundation covers the Horizons Region (Manawatu-Whanganui) including the seven cities and districts of Horowhenua, Manawatu, Palmerston North, Rangitikei, Ruapehu, **Tararua** and Whanganui.

The strength of community foundations is that all donations and bequests are invested and held as permanent endowments. An endowment is a fund with money in it, set up to provide long-term support for a particular non-profit organisation or cause. Each year, the income earned by endowments is available for grants to charities and organisations in the local community.

Te Awa is a locally focused organisation, supported by a framework that covers a region, while also being part of a NZ group of community endowment foundations that provide guidance, encouragement and sharing of resources.

Community foundations are one of the fastest growing forms of philanthropy internationally, with 17 foundations now existing in New Zealand.

Te Awa in Tararua

Tararua District Council has worked with the Te Awa Community Foundation to create local funds that ensure people in our communities can give and invest for the benefit of the place where they live.

Council has seed funded seven local Te Awa funds, these are:

- Tararua District as a whole
- Norsewood & Ormondville
- Dannevirke
- Woodville
- Pahiatua
- Eketāhuna
- Pongaroa & the Coast

Council has also provided funding for a part-time coordinator position to support the growth of the Te Awa Community Foundation in Tararua District.

Tararua District Coordinator

This role encourages and facilitates the growth of donations to funds that support local communities and organisations in the Tararua District.

The District Coordinator will support the core functions of the Te Awa Community Foundation ("the Foundation") in the Tararua District with an emphasis on the community and donor engagement, communication and supporting the administrative functions of the Foundation.

The District Coordinator will work independently and is accountable to and reports to the General Manager and Chairman of the Board. The coordinator will also share data from completed work and present this in the reports to the board.
